

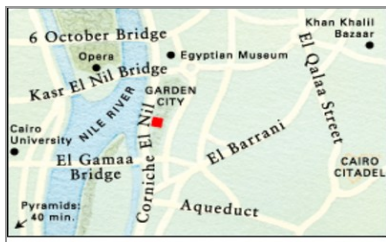

At the crossroads of Asia, Africa and Europe, Cairo combines the world's most ancient civilization with modern dynamism. Rising above the Nile on the legendary Corniche, steps from Belle Époque mansions, Four Seasons shines with the spirit of contemporary Cairo.

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AIRPORT

- Cairo International Airport (CAI): 45 minutes (25 kilometres/15 miles)

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Perfectly located, Four Seasons Hotel Cairo at Nile Plaza rises on the east bank of the Nile River in exclusive Garden City – a neighbourhood of historically significant Belle Époque and Art Deco mansions on tree-lined streets. Soaring 30 stories above the riverside Corniche, the Hotel is part of the prestigious multi-use Nile Plaza Complex. The resort-like Hotel offers 365 extra-large guest rooms and suites with commanding views of the river and the historic Citadel, four pools, Cairo's largest spa and wellness centre, and 10 dining and entertainment options. The riverside setting is a short taxi ride – or scenic felucca sail – from Cairo's museums, bazaars, skyscrapers and embassies.

TRANSPORTATION

Cairo International Airport is served by all major airlines. Car rental is available at the airport, and Hotel limousines – the recommended way to commute between the airport and the Hotel or within the city – can be arranged on request.

Meet and assist service

An airport representative will guide guests through passport control and then to our Four Seasons greeter. Fee applies.

DESTINATION

Dating back 5,000 years, Cairo has – at various times – been called Memphis, Babylon-in-Egypt, Heliopolis, El-Fustat and, most recently, Al-Qahira (The Conqueror). With a population of 18 million sprawling on either side of the Nile, it is Africa's largest city, where past and present meet in a glorious diversity of cultures.

Imbued with ancient mystique, Cairo encompasses some of the most celebrated monuments in the world, including the pyramids, the Citadel, early Christian monasteries and churches, and the mosques of the Mamluk and Ottoman sultans. Modern Cairo is an architectural fusion of old and new, where skyscrapers and ancient monuments stand side by side. Although the city's immensity and diversity are little short of staggering, the pulse of modern action-packed Cairo is balanced by the serene flow of the Nile.

WEATHER

On the shores of the Nile River, Cairo welcomes light breezes that keep daytime temperatures around 26°C (78°F) in spring and autumn. In summer months, Cairo is home to a dry, desert climate with temperatures reaching 38°C (100°F). Winter temperatures sit at around 20°C (67°F) from December to February.

LOCAL ATTRACTIONS AND ACTIVITIES

At Four Seasons, you enjoy a unique vantage point from which to explore the sights, sounds and experiences around you. We hope the highlights of local attractions below help simplify your planning. Please let us know how else we can assist you.

Within a 5-minute drive of the Hotel

Douroub Gallery:

- Exhibition of antique paintings, glass work, silver art, poetry, Goblin works (during August and September) carpets (Egyptian and Persian), gravure, lithographs.

Within a 10-minute drive of the Hotel

Mosques:

- Many fascinating mosques to be explored in Old Cairo, including: Ibn Tulun, built between AD 876 and 879 and the oldest mosque in Cairo; Al-Azhar Mosque, constructed in AD 971 as both a mosque and madrassah (school); the Aqsunqur, or Blue, Mosque, built by Prince Aqsunqur Al-Nassery in AD 1347, so named because of its walls of isnik blue and turquoise mosaic; the Mohammed Ali Mosque (the Alabaster Mosque) within the walls of the Citadel built in AD 1183.

Cairo Opera House Art Gallery:

- Exhibits by artists from Egypt and abroad.

Atelier Du Caire:

- The gallery exhibits contemporary art, paintings, sculpture, by Egyptian artists and artists from abroad.

The Egyptian Museum:

- This is considered one of the most prominent museums in the world. It was built

during the reign of Khedive Abbass Helmi II in 1897, and opened on November 15, 1902. It has 107 halls divided into seven sections, each section devoted to one era in Egypt's history. The museum's most significant showpiece is the Tutankhamun collection.

The Nile Pharaoh & Golden Pharaoh (Nile Cruise Boat):

- Both boats are designed after the ancient Pharaonic Papyrus boats. Each boat consists of two large decks, with open buffet and a large outdoor bar. There are three different cruises each day. The last one for dinner includes an entertaining show with a band, folklore show and belly dancing.

Within a 15-minute drive of the Hotel

First Residence Complex:

- The Four Seasons Hotel Cairo at The First Residence is located in the new First Residence complex in the center of Cairo. The amenities of the complex include three levels of upscale shops and services, a casino, and luxurious residences.

The Cairo Tower:

- The 180-metre (590-foot) tall Cairo Tower was built in 1962. The tower features a rotating restaurant and some stunning views of the city. Located downtown in the Gezira Island area.

El Zamalek Theatre:

- The El Zamalek Theatre presents Egyptian plays in an intimate space.

Egyptian Centre for International Cultural Cooperation:

- The centre offers lectures, exhibitions, recitals, films, and excursions.

Hanager Arts Centre:

- The centre presents exhibits by artists from Egypt and abroad.

Centre of Arts Akhnaton Halls:

- Exhibits of contemporary art, paintings, glass work, silver art, gravure, lithographs and poetry.

Cairo Opera House:

- The new seven-storey opera house is considered a masterpiece of Islamic design and is equipped with the latest audiovisual technology. It houses two indoor theatres and one open-air theatre, rehearsal halls, a museum and library. The art gallery presents exhibits from Egypt and abroad. Located at the National Cultural Centre, Gezira Island.

Gezira Sporting Club:

- The Gezira Sporting Club is the largest multi-sport facility in Egypt. Private lessons are available by reservation in tennis, golf and horseback riding amongst others. The club has a nine hole golf course, 24 clay tennis courts and a running area.

Ferousia Riding Club:

- The Ferousia Riding Club is part of the Gezireh Sporting Club, the largest multi-

purpose sporting club in Egypt. Private lessons are available on request.

The Nile Maxim (Nile Cruise Boat):

- The boat dock is across from the Cairo Marriott Hotel. The buffet dinner is international and you will be treated to a show featuring a band and belly dancing.

The Coptic Churches:

- The Coptic churches include Al-Kaneesah Al-Mu'allaqah (the Hanging Church) which dates back to the late 4th and early 5th century, the church of Abu Sergah (Church of St. Sergius) also founded at the end of the 4th century, and the church of Sitt Barbara (Church of St. Barbara) founded in the 5th century and rebuilt in the 10th century.

Ramses Hilton Annex:

- This shopping centre offers six floors of chain stores and one entertainment floor with two cinemas, two billiard halls and a fast food restaurant.

Within a 20-minute drive of the Hotel

Pharaonic Village:

- Dr. Hassan Ragab spent 20 years creating this most precise living recreation of ancient times. Hundreds of actors and actresses move about the village re-enacting daily life in the time of the Pharaohs. Static and interactive displays, children's entertainment and a restaurant complete the exhibit. Guided tours last two hours.

The British Council:

- The British Council is the United Kingdom's international organisation for education and cultural relations. The gallery presents works by artists from Egypt and abroad.

The Coptic Museum:

- This museum, in Old Cairo just north of the Hanging Church, offers a large collection of Christian objects, including a fine collection of icons and textiles dating as far back as AD 300. There's also a library with 7,000 books and manuscripts. Lush gardens surround the building, which is decorated with many mosaics.

The Khan al-Khalili Bazaar and Sagha:

- Dating back to the 14th century, this market is renowned for its magnificent examples of fine gold and silver work, embroidered clothing, leather goods and hand-carved woodwork. Located just east of downtown.

Within a 30-minute drive of the Hotel

The Museum of Islamic Art:

- The world's rarest and most extensive collection of Islamic art, including tapestries, pottery, carpets, inlaid metalwork, medieval weapons and armor.

Within a 45-minute drive of the Hotel

Cairo International Conference Center:

- It is the only comprehensive conference centre in the country, over 30 hectares (74 acres) of it. Of these, 58,000 square metres (624,312 square feet) have been given over

to conference facilities that are nothing less than state of the art. The Centre is the very latest in conference facilities to ensure that while everything is carried with the greatest possible efficiency, and that your comfort and convenience have been seen to. To start with, the Centre is a mere ten minute drive from Cairo International Airport, a short drive from any one of several five star hotels and a five minute walk from the Cairo International Exhibition Grounds. Catering, secretarial and interpreter services are available.

Sound and Light Show at the Pyramids:

- This enchanting show captivates audiences by re-enacting the history of the Pyramids and the glory of the Pharaohs. The show is presented three times daily in Arabic, English, French, German, Spanish and Italian. Please contact the Concierge for showtimes.

Katameya Heights Golf & Tennis Resort:

- Katameya Heights Golf & Tennis Resort, which opened in January 1977, is a fully operational resort community for those who love the challenge of golf and tennis, while enjoying a wide variety of recreational and social facilities. Apart from the 18 and 9 hole golf courses (with lessons, practice facilities and a pro shop), the resort offers the El Shafei Tennis Ranch, spa and health club, swimming pool, kids clubhouse, and gym. The resort also offers restaurants, bars and lounges.

Horseback Riding at the Pyramids:

- There are many stables near the pyramids offering horseback riding and lessons. Horses are usually rented by the hour, though some block tours are available (e.g., to Saqqara, four hours away).

The Sphinx:

- On the way to the pyramid of Kephren sits the statue of the Great Sphinx of Giza, one of the most famous monuments in the world, a legendary figure with the body of a lion and the face of a man.

Museum of the Solar Boat:

- This museum is south of the Great Pyramid, and is built over the rectangular pit preserving a barque, the wooden boat for the king's journey with the sun god, Ra, to the afterworld. Discovered in 1954, in a completely dismantled state, the 43-metre (140-foot) cedar boat was subsequently restored.

The Pyramids of Giza:

- The Pyramids of Giza are dominated by the Great Pyramid, constructed for King Cheops around 2650 B.C. Close to the eastern flank of the Pyramid of Cheops are three small pyramids dedicated to either his wives or family members. The second pyramid, built for Kephren, son of Cheops, southwest of his father's pyramid, has a simple interior with two entrances on the north side. The third one was built for Mycerinus (Menkaure), Cheops' grandson, lies southwest of the others and is the smallest of the three.

The Districts of Kerdassa and Haraneyya:

- Kerdassa is noted for its embroidered cotton and silk dresses. Haraneyya is Egypt's main center for hand-made carpets.

Within a 1-hour drive of the Hotel

Dreamland Golf and Tennis Resort:

- Located on the outskirts of Cairo, the Golf and Tennis Resort is part of Dreamland City, currently the world's largest private sector development. The golf club hosts an 18 hole course with two on-course snack bars and refreshment carts, a fully stocked pro shop with equipment rental and power carts, locker rooms, international professional instruction private lessons, group clinics and video analysis, a night-lit, turf driving range with six target greens and three practice greens for putting and bunker play. Also at the resort are eight night-lit tennis courts, a swimming pool and the Swiss Inn Restaurant and Lounge. Located 20 kilometres (16 miles) from Cairo in Dreamland City on 6th of October City Road.

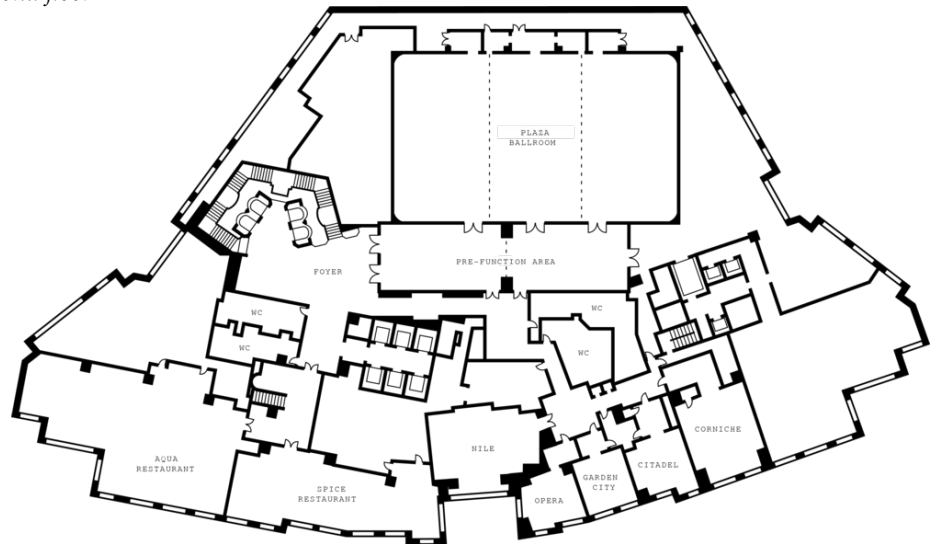

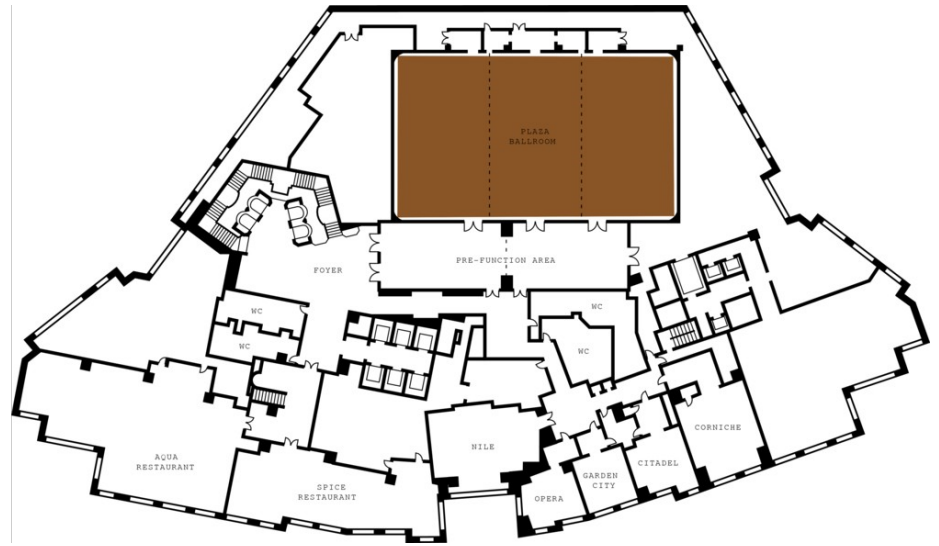

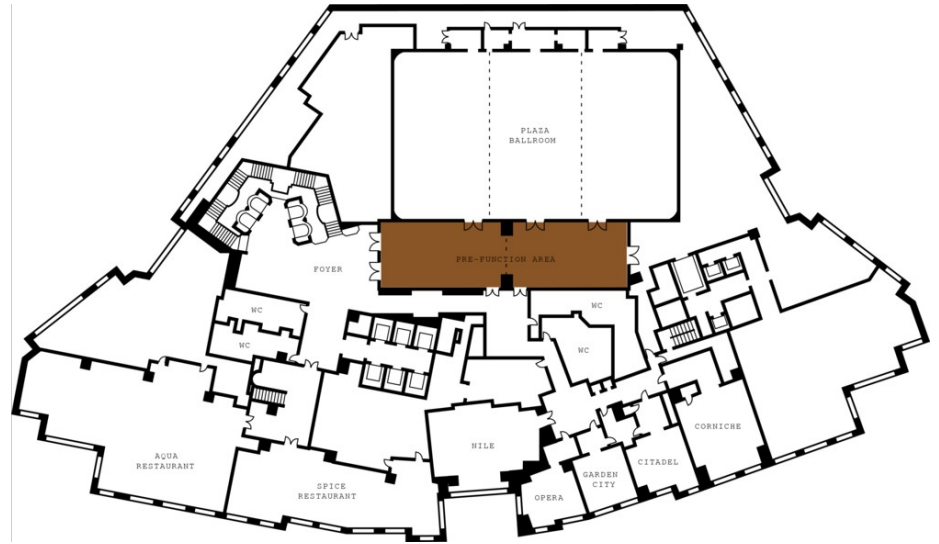


PLAZA PRE-FUNCTION AREA

GUEST ROOMS, SUITES AND PRIVATE RESIDENCES OVERVIEW

Located on the 6th to 30th floors of the Nile Plaza complex, the 366 guest rooms and suites offer panoramic views across the Nile to the island of Zamalek and beyond, or towards the 12th-century Citadel. Reflecting the vibrancy of modern Cairo, the airy interiors feature natural wood finishes and stylishly comfortable furnishings. Most accommodations have a private outdoor terrace for relaxing or dining, and all have triple-glazed windows to ensure that interiors remain cool and quiet.

Up-to-the-minute technology for communication and entertainment includes high-speed wired and wireless Internet access, multi-line telephones, CD and DVD players and a wide selection of international satellite television channels. Signature features in the marble bathrooms include deep-soaking tub, large double vanity and separate glass-walled shower.

Guest Room Overview

Positioned throughout the Hotel, the 305 guest rooms are defined by their location, view and size. Superior Rooms and Deluxe Rooms overlook the Citadel and the pool, and many feature a private terrace. Exotic views over the Nile and the island of Zamalek form the backdrop to the Nile-View Rooms, which feature private outdoor terraces suitable for dining. The larger Premier Nile Rooms are well suited for longer stays. Located on every floor, the expansive Four Seasons Executive Suites overlook the Nile and the island of Zamalek – offering views that may be especially enjoyed from the suites' two private teak-furnished terraces.

Suites Overview

Offering privacy and comfort, the Hotel's 60 suites are located on every floor. The sixth-floor Corniche Suites are perfect for work or relaxation, and include an expansive teak-furnished terrace. The larger Nile Suites feature two private terraces for relaxing and dining. Diplomatic Suites serve as both office and home-away-from-home for longer-stay guests, with a large terrace that overlooks expansive Nile and city views. On the upper floors, the two-bedroom Presidential Suites encompass an extra large living space, private terraces with Nile and city views, and a separate pantry with direct corridor access to

facilitate catering for up to eight guests. Crowning the Nile Plaza tower, the sumptuous three-bedroom Royal Suites offer bird's-eye views of the Nile and the pyramids in the distance, a dining room for 10 with adjoining pantry, a spacious living room, a powder room, an executive study and two expansive terraces.

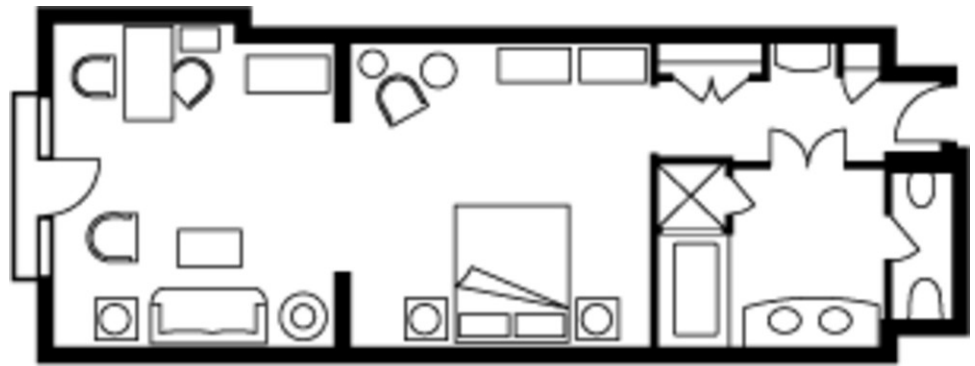

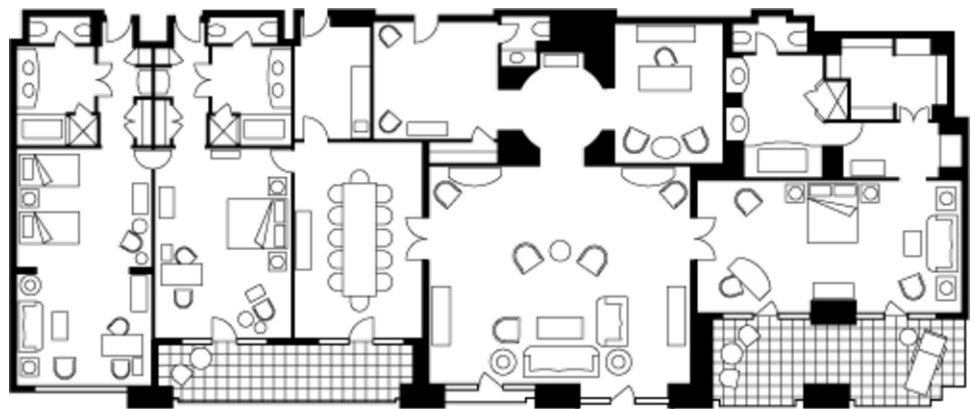

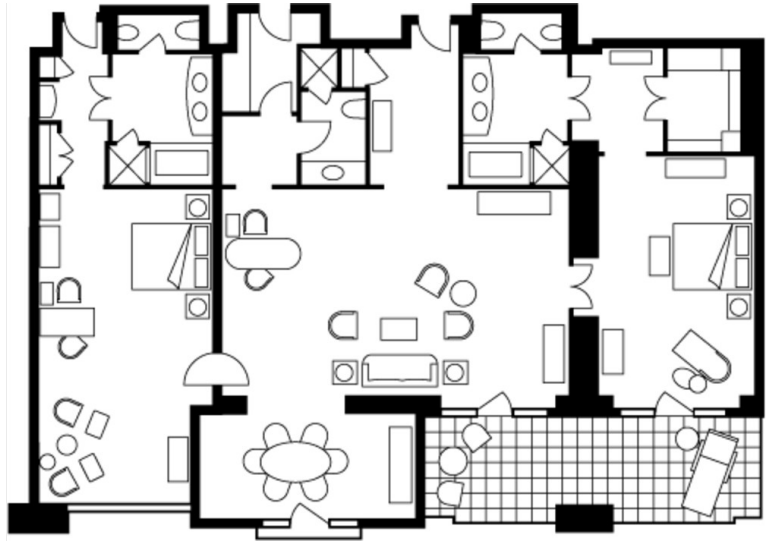

DINING

The 10 restaurants and lounges of Four Seasons Hotel Cairo at Nile Plaza showcase the world's cuisines with Nile views – including stylish *cucina rustica* in Bella, authentic Cantonese cuisine in Spice, the genuine flavours of Egyptian in Zitouni and tasty barbecue in the sunlit Shisha Lounge. Private dining rooms and secluded alcoves in Spice, Aqua, Zitouni and Bella provide intimate dining alternatives for small, exclusive groups.

RESTAURANTS

Bella

A little Italy in the heart of Cairo, Bella offers the specialties of Italy in an inviting, familial setting with direct views overlooking the Nile. Two wood-burning stoves on either side of the restaurant's open kitchen produce fresh, authentic Italian loaves, including focaccia and sciattata.

Steaks

A casual dining experience where spectacular food and outstanding service are second to none, Steaks features premium cuts of beef and rustic-style décor, including rich woods and leathers and original sepia photographs of rural Egyptian settings.

Spice

Overlooking the Nile, Spice presents China's celebrated Cantonese cuisine. The restaurant's modern Asian design creates an elegant dining atmosphere, with fluid, circular patterns of varied shades of wood. Two private dining rooms can each accommodate 8 guests for intimate gatherings, while the open seating area offers a captain's table for a larger group of 10. Authentic Cantonese fare is freshly prepared using local ingredients.

LOUNGES

The Bar

Located between Zitouni and Bella, The Bar is an intimate meeting place overlooking the Nile. A favourite with both local residents and Hotel guests alike, it offers a wide range of assorted cocktails, an excellent selection of wines by the glass and a select list of Cuban cigars. A pianist adds to the cosy ambience, every night. Seats 46.

Lobby Lounge

Adjacent to the bustling Lobby, the Lobby Lounge, with views over the Corniche to the Nile, is in the heart of the action – a convenient spot to meet with colleagues or friends. An elevated seating area seats 59 and combines a traditional dining setting with comfortable couches, chairs and cocktail tables for a more casual, relaxed atmosphere. Light refreshments and cocktails are served throughout the day, while traditional tea is served every afternoon. A pianist entertains throughout the day.

Shisha Lounge

Bathed in sunlight and surrounded by lush foliage, this tropical oasis on the upper pool deck enjoys an airy ambience overlooking the Hotel's three pools.

RECREATION FACILITIES

FITNESS FACILITIES

Open daily, the expansive 24-hour health club has a striking, contemporary ambience with stunning views of the Nile from its floor-to-ceiling windows. Part of the Spa and Wellness Centre, it is the largest facility of its kind in Cairo, and offers state-of-the-art equipment, certified trainers and fitness assessment counsellors to help guests get the most out of their workout. The gym is divisible in two to provide a secluded, private workout space upon request.

POOL

Within a secluded rooftop setting, an extensive outdoor terrace nestles between the Hotel and an adjacent residential tower. Surrounded by lush landscaping, shaded alcoves, cabanas and umbrellas, the terrace's three heated pools offer a calm respite from the city. Seventeen poolside cabanas – available on a daily basis – each offer a large terrace, a private shaded sitting area and their own individual showers and WCs.

Guests may enjoy a dip in the free-form swimming pool, or an aquatic workout in the lap pool, before relaxing in the adjacent whirlpool. A children's play pool is nearby for the exclusive use of children from 4 to 12 years of age. A heated indoor pool is located within the Spa and Wellness Centre for guests 16 years and older.

GOLF

Katameya Heights Golf and Country Club

Located 20 minutes from the airport, this deluxe course offers 18 holes of championship golf, set in endless hills of golfing greens.

Dreamland Golf Course

Designed by Karl Litten, this course has a world-class layout and is conveniently located minutes from the great pyramids of Giza.

LAND SPORTS

Horseback riding

Horseback riding in the desert is an exciting and unique experience. Various stables near the Pyramids offer horseback riding and lessons. Although horses are usually rented by the hour, group tours are also available.

WATER SPORTS

Sailing on the Nile

Memorable Nile cruises are offered on watercrafts designed in the style of ancient Pharaonic papyrus boats. Three different cruises are offered daily, including a dinner cruise featuring a band, folkloric shows and belly dancing.

TOURS AND EXCURSIONS

Half-day tours

Egyptian Museum

Designed and built in 1902 by architect Marcel Dourgnon, the two-storey Egyptian Museum is fronted by a sculpture garden and has a mind-boggling 120,000 objects on display.

With the help of a knowledgeable guide, this in-depth tour will take you through the Tutankhamun collection from the New Kingdom (18th dynasty), funerary objects from the tomb of Sennedjem and his family, sarcophagi and coffins from different periods, the rare collection from the reign of the monotheistic pharaoh, sculptures from all periods of ancient Egypt, and more.

Giza pyramids and the Sphinx

Explore Giza and visit the final resting places of the pharaohs of the fourth dynasty. During this tour, you'll visit three famous pyramids on the Giza plateau: the Great Pyramid (the only remaining of the seven wonders of the ancient world), the Pyramid of Chephren and the Pyramid of Mycerinus. You will also visit the smaller pyramids of the princess and queens.

Your guide will recount recent excavations and discoveries in the area and explain new theories surrounding the enigmatic Sphinx. You can also choose to venture inside a pyramid (please note that a fee applies to enter each of the three pyramids of Giza).

From the pyramids, you'll make your way to the Solar Boat Museum, which houses a royal funerary boat believed to have transported the body of Khufu to the Great Pyramid, either symbolically or literally. It was found intact but excavated in pieces, and has since been reassembled, an endeavour that took 10 years to complete.

On the return trip, the tour will stop at the Papyrus Institute, where you will see how this ancient writing material was produced.

Memphis and Sakkara

This tour will take you to the edge of the desert and the site of the ancient city of Memphis, the first capital of the united Egypt, where you'll see the Alabaster Sphinx and several colossal statues of Rameses II.

From Memphis, you will journey a few kilometres further to Sakkara, one of the largest necropolises in Egypt, which features the Step Pyramid of King Djoser. Dating from 2,780 BC during the third dynasty, it is reputed to be the oldest pyramid in the world. Your guide will take you through the fascinating Mastaba tombs, which depict scenes of the daily life of ancient Egyptian gentry, as well as the burial chamber of a pharaoh.

Finally, you will visit a carpet school to learn how Egyptian artisans produce their masterpieces.

Desert on horseback

For an unforgettable experience, take a sunrise, sunset or full-moon ride across the western desert, overlooking the pyramids of Giza. Experienced riders can choose to ride a fully trained Arabian dancing horse. Horse-drawn carriage rides and camel rides are also available.

Art galleries and museum

Visit the Egyptian Modern Art Museum, Zamalek Art Gallery, Abdeen Palace, Mahmoud Khalil Museum and Islamic Ceramic Museum.

Full-day tours

Old Cairo (includes Coptic Museum and Sultan Hassan Mosque)

This tour will take you on a guided drive through the fascinating streets of Old Cairo. You'll then continue on foot to al-Mu'allaqa (the Hanging Church) and the Church of Abu Serga, where it is said that Mary, Joseph and Jesus rested upon their arrival in Egypt. You will also have the opportunity to explore the Church of St. Barbara and stroll through the ancient streets to Ben Ezra, the oldest synagogue in Egypt.

From there you will make your way to the Coptic Museum, built on the site of the Babylon Fortress. Inside the fortress are several Coptic churches and a rich collection of Coptic art. Finally, you will visit the Sultan Hassan Mosque, built between 1356 and 1363, a masterpiece of Arab architecture in Egypt.

Citadel, mosque and bazaar

Situated near the centre of the city in the Muqattam Hills, the Citadel dominates Cairo's skyline and was the nerve centre of the city and of Egypt for almost 700 years. Construction was begun by Saladin in 1176 and continued until the 1820s, when it was completed under Muhammed Ali. Your guide will recount the rich and varied history of the Citadel, which encompassed residences, palaces and mosques for Mameluke Sultans and Turkish governors within its walls.

This tour also includes a visit to the Sultan Hassan Mosque and the Khan El Khalili, a well-known Cairo bazaar that dates to the 14th century.

Memphis, Sakkara and Dahshur

This tour takes you to the desert and the site of the ancient city of Memphis, the first capital of the united Egypt. Here you'll see the Alabaster Sphinx and several colossal statues of Rameses II.

Just a few kilometres away is Sakkara, one of the largest and most interesting necropolises in Egypt. The Step Pyramid of King Djoser, located here, dates to 2780 BC during the

third dynasty, earning it the reputation as oldest pyramid in the world.

During a guided tour of one of the Mastaba tombs of Old Kingdom nobles, you will see depictions of the daily life of the ancient Egyptian gentry. You'll also have the opportunity to see texts that were found in Sakkara's Old Kingdom pyramids and to visit the burial chamber of a pharaoh.

Dahshur, located 2 kilometres south of Sakkara, forms the southernmost extension of the Necropolis of Ancient Memphis. There you'll have the option of exploring the interior of the red pyramid, named from the reddish limestone it's made from.

The tour also includes a visit to a carpet school, where you'll learn how artisans produce Egyptian carpets.

Alexandria – Pearl of the Mediterranean

Three hours from Cairo is Alexandria, founded by Alexander the Great. Now a lively and cosmopolitan city, Alexandria was established in 331 BC and was once famous for its museum, complex of schools, laboratories, observatories, gymnasium, theatre, markets, baths and a series of lighthouses. One-third of the Alexandrian area used to be occupied by palaces, and the main street of the city was once 30 metres (98 feet) wide.

A guide will accompany you to the Greco-Roman Museum, which was founded by Giuseppe Botti in 1891. Inside the museum you will find mosaics, statues of famous pharaohs and emperors, such as Julius Caesar and Augustus, and the statue of the head of Alexander the Great. The museum houses a unique collection of vases and one of only two Tanagra collections in the world. The Tanagra collection includes a number of small, well preserved statuettes.

You will also visit the underground necropolis of Kom el Shoqafa (Hill of Potsherds), one of the most famous Greco-Roman necropolises in the world. It served as a burial place from the first century to the fourth century and was discovered in 1900, when a donkey pulling a cart fell into a deep shaft leading to this monumental treasure.

This tour will also take you through other notable sights in Alexandria, including Pompei's Pillar, the Roman theatre and the gardens around the royal Montaza Palace.

Safari in Fayoum

Located approximately 80 kilometres (50 miles) southwest of Cairo, Fayoum is an oasis in the western desert. Its climate is warm year-round, and the area features green landscapes surrounded by desert, as well as lakes rife with rich archaeological and geological treasures.

This off-road adventure will take you through three areas in the Fayoum oasis. First, you'll travel by four-wheel-drive vehicle to Wadi el-Hitansee to see the fossilised skeletons of primitive whales, shark teeth, shells and other marine life. Then you'll travel to Wadi el-Rayan to visit the man-made wetlands formed in 1973 and the surrounding protected area, which showcases a variety of landscapes, formations and wildlife. Finally, you'll stop at Medinet Madi, monumental ruins that include the only preserved Middle Kingdom temple in Egypt, featuring sculpted texts and scenes.
