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High in Wyoming's Teton Mountains, on the doorstep of Grand Teton and Yellowstone National Parks, Four Seasons Resort Jackson Hole offers a dynamic all-season playground. Nestled between majestic mountains and valleys of wildflowers, the Resort inspires year-round adventure and relaxation – with ski-in/ski-out access in winter and championship golf and wilderness exploration in warmer months.



Blending the charm of an alpine lodge with sleek modern sophistication, Four Seasons Resort Jackson Hole features 156 guest accommodations, including 106 guest rooms, 18 suites and 32 private residences. Fireplaces warm every corner of the contemporary wood and stone interiors, creating the ambience of a cosy mountain hideaway.

Dining is enhanced by panoramic mountain vistas. Gatherings take place in a casually chic ballroom, flowing outdoors to a terrace and lawn. For relaxation, there's a full-service alpine spa, a year-round outdoor pool and hot-spring-style whirlpools.

Dramatically situated on a 5.5-acre (2.2-hectare) slope, Four Seasons enjoys a prime location at the base of Jackson Hole Mountain Resort. This privileged setting offers peak views and close proximity to all the major ski lifts. Set within Teton Village, it's just a few steps to shops, restaurants and bars.

#### TRANSPORTATION

Jackson Hole WY Airport is serviced by Delta and United Airlines year round and American Airlines, Northwest Airlines and Frontier Airlines seasonally. DESTINATION

High in the Rockies, on the doorstep of Grand Teton and Yellowstone National Parks, the jagged peaks of Wyoming's Teton Range rise abruptly over pristine forests, fast-running rivers and the broad, flat valley known as Jackson Hole. Wrapped in such splendour, this celebrated year-round outdoor resort offers invigorating mountain air, skies dense with stars, and an astonishing profusion of wildlife.

Winter's deep snows offer powder skiing, snowboarding, cross-country skiing and dog sledding for all skill levels. Spring and summer activities range from fly-fishing and river rafting to rock climbing, horseback riding, kayaking, mountain biking, golfing and tennis.

This inspirational setting supports a thriving theatre, art and music scene, while countless films have made the most of Jackson Hole's magnificent alpine vistas. The town of Jackson – 12 miles (19 kilometres) away from the Hotel – has a population of about 8,600, but many more visitors arrive regularly to experience the vast unspoiled wilderness and the romance of the Old West.

WEATHER

Set high in the Rockies, Jackson Hole WY enjoys a dry climate highlighted by long, warm summer days and some of the best winter conditions to be found in North America. Spring is cool, offering showers and brilliant sunny days. Summer temperatures can be quite warm during the day, but evenings are often chilly. Fall weather is gradually cooler, but remains warm enough for many summertime activities from fishing to hiking. In the winter, December and January are the coldest months with an average annual snowfall of 150 inches (381 centimetres). But with the dry air, it often feels warmer than the temperature indicates.

LOCAL ATTRACTIONS AND ACTIVITIES

Four Seasons offers a unique vantage point from which to explore the surrounding sights, sounds and experiences. Begin with a tour of the Resort's art collection, then explore the area's natural beauty in the national parks, visit a nearby museum or enjoy an outdoor adventure. The highlights of local attractions that follow provide a taste of the region's sight-seeing opportunities. To enhance your stay at this exceptional Teton Village resort, the Concierge is always on-hand to offer additional assistance and insight.

*Onsite*

Art collection at the Resort:

- Four Seasons Resort Jackson Hole features a museum-quality collection of modern and contemporary art, including works by surrealist painter Joan Miro and local photographer and explorer Paul Lawrence. Jackson Hole as a destination is known to collectors for its art galleries that specialise in wildlife art. The Resort's collection rounds out the art lover's experience with both historical and contemporary interpretations of an eclectic grouping of more than 2,000 prints, drawings, photographs and paintings.

Grand Teton Music Festival:

- The Grand Teton Music Festival aims to enhance everyone's enjoyment and

appreciation of classical music. On Friday mornings at 10:00 am, you can attend the final rehearsal before the weekend concerts. In the evenings, enjoy concerts given by popular artists. The Grand Teton Music Festival runs during the summer months.

Walk Festival Hall:

- The intimate 740-seat Walk Festival Hall in Teton Village is acclaimed for its acoustics, and is home to the nationally recognised Grand Teton Music Festival. From June through August, the Festival Orchestra performs at more than 40 concerts, from full orchestra to chamber music, a spotlight on unique musical themes, family and children's concerts. From January through March, a programme of concert series and lectures is offered. Throughout the summer, the annual Teton Village Summer Festival offers a series of events, from classic car shows to art and antique shows and a Native American festival.

Jackson Hole Mountain Resort:

- On the doorstep of Four Seasons, Jackson Hole Mountain Resort is renowned for its rugged, varied terrain, deep light snow and endless back-country, and offers some of the country's best ski and snowboard experiences. On an average day, there are less than 2,000 skiers on the 2,500-acre ski area, offering the lowest skier density in the country. Dogsledding, sleigh rides, heli-skiing, snowshoeing, and cross country skiing are other winter favourites. The Resort's winter season runs from late November to early April. In the summer, from late May through early October, guests can enjoy hiking, mountain biking, rock climbing, gondola rides, tram rides, paragliding, hot air balloon rides and the Kids Ranch Summer Camp.

Teton Village:

- Teton Village is just steps away from the hotel and offers great places to shop for top-of-the-line ski and snowboard gear, outerwear and accessories.

*Within a 5-minute drive of the Resort*

Grand Teton National Park:

- Grand Teton National Park is famous for the saw-toothed peaks and broad canyons of the Teton Range. This is a 40 mile (65 kilometre) long, seven to nine mile (11 to 14.5 kilometre) wide mountain block. Grand Teton, the highest peak, towers more than a mile above the valley of Jackson Hole, rising to 13,770 feet (4,198 metres). Twelve other mountains in the range rise over 12,000 feet (3,658 metres). Approximately 50 miles (80 kilometres) of Snake River lie within Grand Teton National Park, forming the headwaters of the extensive Columbia River system. Also within the park are seven glacial lakes and more than one hundred alpine and backcountry lakes. The park is open year round and for car traffic from May through October.

*Within a 10-minute drive of the Resort*

Snake River:

- A float trip on the Snake River is one of the best ways to see Grand Teton National Park's wildlife. The river is a mix of raging white water for some of the best rafting in the United States, and gentle currents for scenic floats through meadows of wildflowers and wildlife sanctuaries. Fly fishing opportunities for trout and whitefish abound.

Bar J Chuckwagon:

- In the old days on the cattle drive, the cowboys would spend the evening telling tall tales and enjoying music at the chuckwagon. Now, you can experience the spirit of the old West too – after a long day, stop in at the Bar J Chuckwagon supper and western show for old-style Western hospitality. Bar J is a working cattle ranch complete with delicious food and family entertainment in an atmosphere of bygone days.

*Within a 20-minute drive of the Resort*

Center Street Gallery:

- Specialising in modern and contemporary art, Center Street Gallery focuses on original paintings and sculpture depicting a variety of subject matter. The Gallery represents approximately 30 nationally and internationally recognised artists, with styles including American modernism and abstract expressionism.

Center for the Arts:

- The Center for the Arts is a growing art centre campus in downtown Jackson. The Performing Arts Pavilion hosts theatrical and musical events in its 500-seat theatre and music centre. For more information on current events and exhibits visit the web site or contact our Concierge.

Jackson Hole Rodeo:

- For action-packed fun in the summer, there's nothing like the rodeo – it's one of the West's favourite events. The Jackson Hole Rodeo is noted for its fine stock. Because it's smaller than rodeos in other parts of the state, it has been able to maintain its "anyone who has the gumption can do it" attitude. Come out and enjoy barrel racing, calf roping, bull riding, saddle bronc riding, bareback bronc riding and Just For Kids events.

Historical Jackson Hole Playhouse:

- The Jackson Hole Playhouse has had a chequered career. Built in 1916, it served as a car dealership, bowling alley and billiard hall before it became the Pink Garter Theatre in the 1950s and, finally, the Jackson Hole Playhouse. Diamond Lil performed there, and so have many other famous performers over the years, from Rock Hudson to Olivia Newton John. You'll see such Broadway musical favourites as *Oklahoma*, *Seven Brides for Seven Brothers*, *The Sound of Music* and *Paint Your Wagon*. Come and enjoy a rowdy Western good time! Open June through September.

Off Square Theatre Company:

- Enjoy year-round professional theatre in Jackson Hole, with the Off Square Theatre Company. It presents quality theatre and theatre education for children and adults, locals and visitors, theatre professionals and non-professionals alike. You'll be informed, amused and challenged. Past productions have included *Oliver!* and the *Why Be Blue Musical Cabaret*.

The Town Square Shoot-Out:

- Come watch a re-enactment of frontier justice in the Jackson Town Square. This is the longest running shoot-out in the country.

Mountain Trails Gallery:

- Mountain Trails Gallery offers a mix of traditional Western and contemporary New West genres, including landscape, wildlife, plein-air, impressionist and bronze fine art, in 3,500 square feet (325 square metres) of gallery space.

Legacy Gallery:

- Offering representational and impressionist art for over 18 years, the Legacy Gallery represents over 60 nationally known and up-and-coming artists. The gallery specialises in paintings and sculpture depicting a variety of subject matter, including Western, figurative, wildlife, landscape and still life. Works by deceased 19th and 20th century artists are also presented. Staff are on hand to advise on placing fine art, including life-size bronze sculptures, in home, garden or corporate settings.

The Jackson Hole Historical Society and Museum:

- In downtown Jackson, the Jackson Hole Historical Society and Museum is a repository of early photographs and other items of historical significance, such as trade beads, antique furniture, pistols and Indian artefacts. The Museum is open from Memorial Day through Labor Day.

Jackson:

- Shopping in Jackson offers an appealing mix of exclusive boutiques, outdoor stores and shops that highlight Jackson Hole's Old West heritage -; from exotic food products, such as buffalo meat and huckleberry sauce, to artwork that ranges from Western and wildlife themes to Native American and contemporary art. You can also explore Jackson's many galleries and boutiques. The town boasts over 35 art galleries and is considered third in the country as a Western art centre.

Trailside Galleries:

- Trailside Galleries represents a number of North America's premier Western artists. A wide range of genres is presented, including landscape, Native American, cowboy, wildlife and Southwestern. Media include oil and watercolour, gouache, bronze and woodcarving. A selection of limited edition, high-quality prints -; including many artist proof (AP) prints, signed and numbered by the artist -; is offered.

*Within a 25-minute drive of the Resort*

National Elk Refuge:

- The Jackson Elk Herd, the largest elk herd in the world, has a population of approximately 14,000 -; more than 7,500 of which spend the winter on the 25,000-acre (10,120-hectare) National Elk Refuge. Located 3 miles (5 kilometres) north of Jackson, on the flat meadows surrounding the Gros Ventre River, the National Elk Refuge operates a supplemental feeding programme for the elk to help them survive the winter without raiding the farmers' haystacks. Horse-drawn sleigh rides among the elk are available mid-December through March. Hours vary seasonally.

National Museum of Wildlife Art:

- The National Museum of Wildlife Art boasts some of the best wildlife art in the country. Featured artists among its collection of some 2,000 paintings, sculptures, photographs and works on paper include John J. Audubon, Robert Bateman, Pablo Picasso and renowned local artist Carl Runguis. The museum strives to enrich and inspire man's relationship with nature by focusing its exhibitions and programmes on

wildlife. Located just 3 miles (5 kilometres) north of Jackson, the museum sits on a hillside overlooking the 20,000-acre (8,000-hectare) National Elk Refuge.

*Within a 45-minute drive of the Resort*

Jenny Lake and Jackson Lake:

- In Grand Teton National Park, Jenny Lake and Jackson Lake are particularly popular for hiking, canoeing, boating, swimming and fishing. South Jenny Lake is a favourite for hiking, and a scenic drive alongside the lake is particularly pleasant.

*Within a 1.5-hour drive of the Resort*

Yellowstone National Park:

- Yellowstone National Park is America's oldest and foremost National Park. Encompassing 2.2 million acres, it boasts more geysers than anywhere else on the globe. It has 250 active geysers out of a total of 10,000 geothermal features, including the world-renowned Old Faithful. Yellowstone's Grand Canyon is 1,200 feet (366 metres) deep and highlighted by the powerful Upper Falls. Its mountain-range wilderness is a refuge for wildlife such as grizzly bear, elk, bald eagles, American bison, moose and wolf. The park is open to the public from mid-April through November; and from mid-December through mid-March for over-snow vehicles.

*Within a 3-hour drive of the Resort*

Grizzly and Wolf Discovery Center :

- On the western boundary of Yellowstone National Park, the Grizzly and Wolf Discovery Center in West Yellowstone, Montana is a not-for-profit bear and wolf preserve that provides visitors with a unique opportunity to learn about, view and ultimately appreciate the grizzly bear and grey wolf.

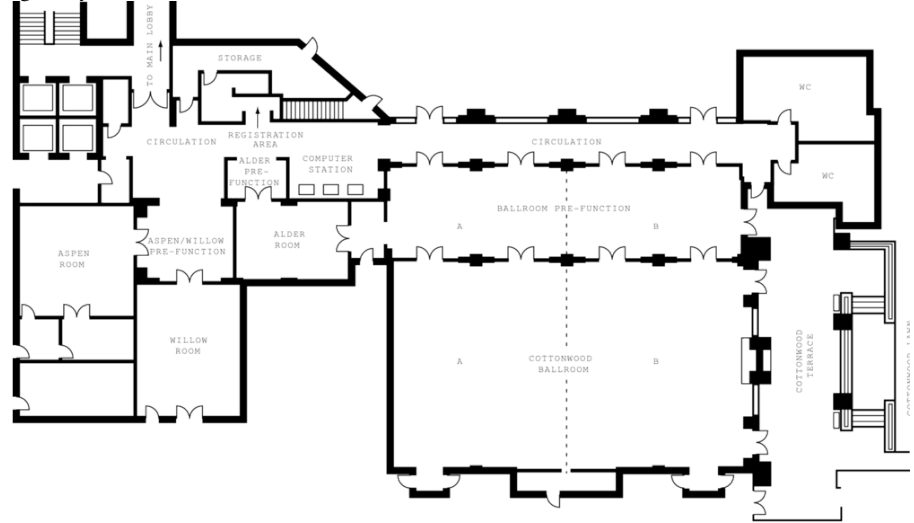

### GUEST ROOMS, SUITES AND PRIVATE RESIDENCES OVERVIEW

In a 10-storey lodge-style building, Four Seasons Resort Jackson Hole offers 106 guest rooms, 18 suites and 32 private residences. All of these Teton Village accommodations are generously sized and embody the spirit of a mountain retreat with dark wood and natural stone finishes, accented by leather insets. Comfortable, residential-style furnishings in these Jackson Hole accommodations are arranged around a gas-burning fireplace. Most rooms open to a private balcony or terrace furnished with a teak table and chairs.

A well-defined work area allows guests to remain productive. State-of-the-art technology includes high-speed Internet access and at least three direct-dial, dual-line telephones. For entertainment, there's a large television and a DVD entertainment centre.

Spacious ensuite marble bathrooms evoke the American West with wicker furniture, stone tile and colourful area rugs with Native American motifs. Signature Four Seasons features include a deep soaking tub, separate glass-walled shower, large double vanity and a WC with telephone in a separate alcove.

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#### *Guest Room Overview*

The collection of 106 guest rooms captures the style of a mountain chalet. Standard Rooms offer a comfortable sitting area enhanced by either a furnished private terrace or a gas fireplace with picture window. Deluxe and Premium Rooms include a furnished terrace and a living area with fireplace. Four Seasons Executive Suites provide separate sleeping and living areas enhanced by both fireplace and terrace. Windows offer mountain, valley or courtyard views.

#### *Suites Overview*

Offering additional space for privacy and relaxation, the 18 suites at Four Seasons Resort Jackson Hole encompass generous living and dining areas, in addition to separate bedrooms – perfect for longer-staying guests or families travelling together.

Options range from Deluxe and Premium One-Bedroom Suites to Specialty Suites with one to three bedrooms. The pinnacle of Jackson Hole prestige, the expansive Presidential Suite includes up to three bedrooms, a full dining room for eight and a private den. Panoramic eighth-floor views encompass the mountain and ski lifts.

#### *Private Residence Overview*

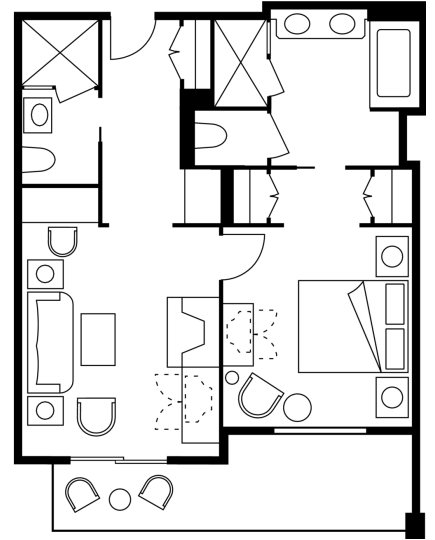

The ultimate skiing adventure. High Mountain Heli-Skiing transports you to any of five surrounding mountain ranges for a day of unforgettable skiing or snowboarding on fresh, untracked snow. Skiers can expect a full day of skiing at 12,000 to 15,000 vertical feet (3,658 to 4,572 metres).

- Nature ski – Half-day and full-day tours through Grand Teton National Park will give you a real taste of the beauty of Jackson Hole. Included are a biologist guide, snacks or lunch, warm beverages and transportation. Hole Hiking provides complimentary snowshoe equipment; cross-country skis are available for rent.
- Snowmobile and snow coach – Guided snowmobile tours are an ideal way to explore winter landscapes and view wildlife in Yellowstone, the Gros Ventre Range or along the route to the warm waters at Granite Hot Springs. Choose from a range of half-day excursions to three-day adventures; most options include a snack or meals. Our Concierge looks forward to assisting you in selecting the ideal snowmobile trip. Snow coach tours are great for families with younger children. These guided tours take you through Yellowstone in the comfort of a heated snow coach; on a full-day excursion, lunch is provided at the Snow Lodge. Adventures on land, water and sky begin from the doors of our Base Camp.

Our full-service outdoor adventure Concierge, Base Camp at Four Seasons Resort Jackson Hole provides guests with the information, guidance and equipment required to best experience the vast offerings of Jackson Hole's outdoor playground. Our Base Camp counsellors can give advice and make arrangements for all of your adventures in our backyard and beyond. Exciting options are available for all ages and levels of ability.

### *Water activities*

#### *Fly fishing*

Jackson Hole is known as a Mecca for fly fishing, drawing enthusiasts from around the globe. Our in-house director of fly fishing offers casting and fly-tying lessons, and expert instruction and guiding on private float trips in a hand-crafted wooden boat. Just minutes from Four Seasons Resort Jackson Hole, Snake River offers abundant wildlife viewing, unsurpassed sceneries of the Tetons – and world-class fly fishing for native cut-throat trout. Day trips and custom fly-fishing vacation packages are available.

#### *Kayaking and canoeing*

Paddle and play in the waters of Jackson Hole's rivers and lakes. Choose your vessel: a flat-water or sport kayak, a traditional canoe or even an inflatable kayak "duckie." The Snake and Hoback rivers offer more thrills with exciting, swift rapids. If you prefer a tranquil afternoon, glide through the calm waters of String Lake or Leigh Lake in Grand Teton National Park. For boat rentals, lessons or even a picnic lunch, the Base Camp will happily make the necessary arrangements so you can focus on having fun.

#### *White-water rafting and scenic floats*

Jackson Hole is home to a wide range of river-running options. Trips vary from a calm, scenic trip on the upper Snake River to a wild ride on the rapids of the lower Snake. The calm section meanders through Grand Teton National Park, offering unique perspectives on the mountains and a safe way to see wildlife. The exciting lower stretch of the Snake River runs the white water of the Snake River Canyon. Experience Big Kahuna, Lunch Counter and other fun rapids rated from Class II to Class IV, depending on conditions. Some river guide vendors include: Sands, Barker Ewing, Mad River, Dave Hansen and Jackson Hole Whitewater.

#### *Wooden boat tours*

Enjoy a private scenic float in a handmade wooden boat with the option of a gourmet catered riverside meal and fly fishing. A. J. DeRosa's Wooden Boat Tours will provide guests with a memorable experience on the river.

### *Air activities*

#### *Air tour*

Let the magic of motorless flight in one of the world's most awe-inspiring areas provide you with the adventure of a lifetime: soar over the spectacular Teton Mountain Range in a glider. The tour starts in Driggs, Idaho, with a tow up the west side of the Grand Teton, approximately 11,700 feet (3,566 metres) above the valley floor. Then enjoy the leisurely soar back to the airport in Driggs. If a glider is not your thing, hop on board a Cessna 172 and fly above the Bridger-Teton and Targhee National Forests and Teton Valley, Idaho, and take advantage of phenomenal photography opportunities.

#### *Hot-air ballooning*

Fly in a balloon over the largest remaining private open space in Jackson Hole, a working ranch bordered by Grand Teton National Park, the Bridger-Teton National Forest and the Snake River. Enjoy breathtaking views of the Teton Mountain Range, Jackson Hole Ski and Mountain Resort and Teton Village from 1,500 to 4,000 feet (460 to 1,200 metres) above the valley floor.

#### *Paragliding*

Tandem paragliding is truly an unforgettable experience. Float over the town of Jackson Hole and its surrounding wilderness with a certified USHGA paragliding instructor who will ensure your safety as you take in the inspiring valley views.

#### *Land activities*

##### *Alpine slide*

On the Snow King Mountain, rising from the town of Jackson, ride the chairlift to the top of the mountain and thrill to the adventure of the alpine slide, a luge-inspired ride that hurtles through 2,500 feet (760 metres) of wildflowers and forest. Your slide-ride down can be as relaxing or exhilarating as you like. You control your own speed – no special skills are required. Slide opens Memorial Day weekend.

##### *Wildlife safaris*

During these private tours led by one of our in-house wildlife biologists and the Resort's naturalist, you can experience customised four-hour expeditions in Grand Teton National Park, the Bridger Teton National Forest and the National Elk Refuge. Travel in an SUV equipped with Swarovski spotting scopes and binoculars. Gourmet wraps are prepared by the Resort's chefs.

Private wildlife adventures give you the opportunity to safely and comfortably view magnificent creatures in their natural habitat, beyond the highways and in remote areas. Along the way, you will learn about the flora and fauna, geology and history of this significant ecosystem, and have the opportunity to view elk, moose, mule deer, bison, bears, wolves, mountain lions, bighorn sheep, bald eagles, river otters, trumpeter swans, owls and other rare birds. Our biologists will customise the route based on recent wildlife sightings and your specific interests.

As part of the Junior Ecologist programme the Resort has created for children, younger guests will receive their very own adventure pack to be used during the tour. The pack is filled with interactive equipment designed just for kids, and allows them to explore a variety of hands-on specimen samples such as animal pelts, scat, claws and skulls.

##### *Mountain bike*

Pedal your way through a half- or full-day adventure on Rendezvous Mountain or further into the pristine Jackson Hole backcountry. Base Camp provides in-house mountain bike rentals, helmets and any other equipment you may need, and most trails on Rendezvous Mountain can be accessed by chairlift. A broad variety of mountain bike trails is available in Grand Teton and Yellowstone National Parks, the Bridger-Teton and Targhee National Forest areas or Cache Creek Canyon, a more challenging trail system. Riders of all ages and levels can enjoy pedalling through fields of wildflowers, along mountain ridges, through aspen groves and alongside rivers and streams.

Our Base Camp counsellors can help with self-guided excursions or can enlist a professional mountain bike guide. Teton Mountain Bike Tours offers private guides, and Hoback Sports offers private tours with instruction. For all mountain biking excursions, we recommend that you bring sturdy shoes, a camera, a wind/rain shell, shorts, sunglasses, sunscreen, extra water and snacks. Guides and instructors will supply the bike, helmet, gloves, water bottle and transportation from the Resort.

#### Road bike

Paved or hard-packed roads and trails throughout Jackson Hole offer dramatic views and the possibility of wildlife sightings. Families and recreational riders will enjoy riding along the National Elk Refuge Road or The Pathways. More experienced cyclists will enjoy the challenge of Teton Pass. Adult and children's road bikes and cruisers are available for rent through the Resort's Base Camp.

#### Four Seasons Explorer Backpacks

Four Seasons Explorer Backpacks are full of fun activity items, such as a compass, binoculars, sun photo paper, exploration boxes and more. These backpacks can be checked out for day use at our Base Camp and are a great way for younger guests to explore their surroundings, either with the whole family or on their own. Upon returning full backpacks, little adventurers are given a souvenir to travel home with.

#### *Chuckwagon supper ride*

Experience the spirit of the Old West with a chuckwagon supper ride aboard an 1800s-style, horse-drawn covered wagon. Enjoy a barbecue dinner and a traditional Western music show complete with bluegrass music and Wyoming ranch stand-up comedy. Children and adults of all ages will get a kick out of this memorable evening of cowboy culture.

#### *Golf*

Teton Pines is a full-service, semi-private championship golf course offering tee boxes of varying levels, many water features and large greens. This 18-hole course, opened in 1987, was designed by Arnold Palmer. Located just 5 miles (8 kilometres) from the Resort, the course offers a pro shop, golf instruction, club rentals, driving range and putting green.

Jackson Hole Golf and Tennis Club is the valley's first full-service championship 18-hole golf course. Opened in 1963 and redesigned in 1973 by Robert Trent Jones II, it showcases some of Jackson Hole's most breathtaking Teton views. This semi-private club is consistently ranked number one in the state of Wyoming by *Golf Digest* magazine. Located just 20 miles (32 kilometres) from the Resort, the club offers a pro shop, golf instruction, club rentals, driving range and putting green.

### *Hiking*

Right outside the Resort's Base Camp or minutes away in Grand Teton National Park, hikes to dazzling mountain peaks, waterfalls and glacial lakes abound. Panoramic valley views will take your breath away. Explore countless hiking trails, from beginner's level to advanced. For those who choose to go on their own, Base Camp counsellors can provide all the necessary information, maps, directions and recommendations, including where to go and what to bring, wear, look for and expect. They can acquaint you with the wildflowers, wildlife, birds, history and geology of the greater Yellowstone ecosystem. Bring your camera to capture the stunning landscape and rare wildlife. For those who prefer on-trail guidance, Base Camp counsellors can arrange daily ranger-led hikes in Grand Teton National Park as well as naturalist-led hikes into the National Park and National Forest adjacent to the Resort. The Hole Hiking Experience provides private guided hikes in Bridger Teton National Forest.

### *Horseback riding*

Horseback riding in Jackson Hole offers the romance of Old West-style travel and exploration combined with the chance to see an abundance of rare and magnificent wildlife. From Teton Village, ride north into Grand Teton National Park, either exploring Granite Canyon or looking for wildlife on the Valley Trail. There is a variety of horseback riding outfitters; all have an eight-year-old age minimum and suggest bringing long pants, insect repellent, hat, sunscreen, closed-toe shoes or cowboy boots, and a camera.

Green River Outfitters – Located an hour from the Resort, Green River Outfitters provide transportation to and from their camp. This outfitter offers a full-day experience that includes lunch at an authentic trapper cabin on site. Half-day trips are available as well; these do not include a visit to the trapper cabin. One of our most popular outfitters with families, Green River offers many additional activities at the camp, including lake fishing. Because of the long duration of the rides, this outfitter is best for families with older children.

Goosewing Ranch – Located about an hour from the Resort, Goosewing Ranch offers half- or full-day rides into the Gros Ventre backcountry. Goosewing will provide transportation to and from the Resort, as well as lunch on site. Ideal for couples on a romantic holiday, this area is exceptionally pristine and remote, offering a serene, private experience. These trips are perfect for the more experienced rider.

Spring Creek Ranch – Just a 20-minute drive from the Resort, Spring Creek Ranch offers rides from one to four hours' duration, offering 360-degree views of the Tetons and the surrounding mountain ranges. This is a great option for families who enjoy both convenience and flexibility, and don't want to dedicate an extensive amount of time to the activity.

Colter Bay Village – Located within Grand Teton National Park, Colter Bay offers horseback rides in Grand Teton National Park, including breakfast and dinner rides and one- and two-hour rides during the day.

### *Picnicking*

Base Camp counsellors can arrange for guests to enjoy a picnic at one of the following scenic spots:

Curtis Canyon – Offering views of Jackson, Snow King Mountain and the Tetons to the north, Curtis Canyon is a short, scenic drive past the prairies of the National Elk Refuge.

The Wedding Tree – This popular spot for couples tying the knot is also the perfect place for a picnic, with stunning views of the Tetons and the option of stopping by nearby Slide Lake.

Schwabacher's Landing – A prime spot to view wildlife including moose, elk, otter eagle and waterfowl, this area is also a favourite location for photographers, with the Grand Teton reflecting in the still waters of Snake River.

Blacktail Butte – This location offers panoramic views of Gros Ventre range, the Tetons, the distant Salt and Wind River Ranges and the valley and waterways of Jackson Hole in between.

Jenny Lake – From the South Jenny Lake trailhead, a 3-mile (5-kilometre) hike will lead you to the famous Hidden Falls and Inspiration Point, where there are spectacular views of Jenny Lake and Jackson Valley.

Oxbow Bend – Located in Grand Teton National Park, Oxbow Bend is a few miles past the Moran entrance gate. This site is excellent for viewing moose, bald eagles and the white pelican.

#### *Rock climbing and mountaineering*

Challenge your mind, body and spirit as you rock climb in Grand Teton National Park, either just outside the Resort's Base Camp or minutes north in the Tetons. After learning the fundamental skills, from knot-tying to climbing techniques, you'll be ready to ascend an unlimited variety of rock faces suited to your level, whether you are a first-time climber or a more experienced mountaineer. World-renowned, highly trained Exum Mountain Guides are available through our Base Camp to provide the very best instruction to help you complete exciting, triumphant and beautiful climbs safely.

#### *Tennis*
